What is ORMP?

The Office of Research Misconduct Proceedings (ORMP) is responsible for

reporting research misconduct, including research processes, or misappropriation of data or results such as not accurately representing research record. The ORMP is responsible for the appropriation of another person's research processes, results, or misappropriation of appropriate credit.

not:

an adequate amount of language in a field, or collaborators on a project, or differences of opinion.

At that point the complainant becomes a witness to the proceedings. They may be called upon for additional information or interviews. The University shall strive to honor a complainant's request that the complainant's identity in a research misconduct proceeding remain confidential. The University will not tolerate retaliation against complainants, witnesses, experts, Advisory Committee members, or others for their involvement in a research misconduct proceeding.

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The Office of Research Misconduct Proceedings (ORMP) is guided by [Executive Order No. 61](#)

Throughout the process the evidence must be sufficient and specific enough to warrant continuing to the subsequent phase. The full process includes:

- x initial review of the complaint,
- x notification of the respondent,
- x sequestration of research materials and review of said materials,
- x investigation by an ad-hoc Advisory Committee, and
- x a decision by the dean as to whether research misconduct occurred.
